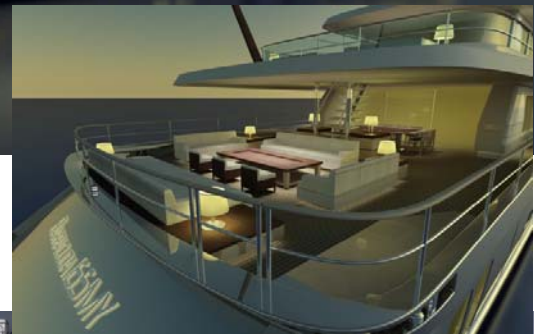


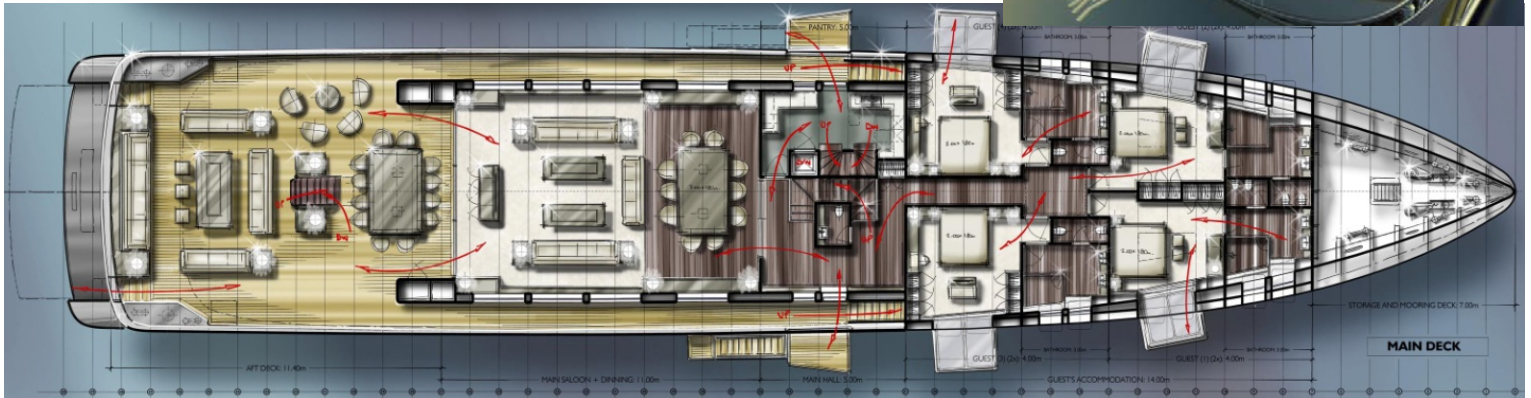
## NEW BARRACUDA 50M MOTOR YACHT CONCEPT 'UNVEILED AT THE MONACO YACHT SHOW'

**EMBODYING BALANCE AND RESTRAINT WITHIN A SLENDER AND EFFICIENT HULL – OUR LATEST DESIGN FOR A NEW MOTOR YACHT CONCEPT WILL BE UNVEILED AT THE MONACO YACHT SHOW ON STAND DG I.**

Intent on bypassing short-term fashion and avoiding any unnecessary excess, our design could be fairly described as attractive yet understated, with an almost 'military-esque' feel about it. Entry is made via a starboard side door to a lobby leading to the main saloon and dining area or, by turning right, down a corridor



where four luxurious guest rooms are located. Guests will no doubt delight in the simple, yet pleasant avoidance of having to climb up and down stairs all day to reach the main living and aft deck areas. Guest rooms at this height above sea level will also benefit from plenty of natural light large, double 'seascape' windows for each room. One of two double window sets per room can be fully lowered to



provide standing height, balcony-style vistas for the lucky inhabitants inside. On the upper/bridge deck and amidships for the best possible comfort, the owner's suite comprises a large bedroom with separate walk-in wardrobe, bathroom and vanity area, along with an aft-deck of the utmost privacy. Forward of the owner's suite, stairs provide access either up or down to the main deck or the fly-bridge / Jacuzzi deck. Ensuring the privacy of guests, crew members have their own separate stairway system that interconnects each of the four decks and the yacht's main service areas. On the lower deck, a stern door opens to form a large swimming and boarding platform. Behind this a combined Beach Club/Gym benefits from almost 180° views and, in common with the guest rooms, also has large side openings that double as windows when closed. These will avoid the often dark & gloomy 'cave effect' that other beach clubs suffer from.
